

Over 2000 gallons of trash collected as part of The Great Global Cleanup

(ALBUQUERQUE, N.M.) – As part of Earth Day and Earth Month, PNM joined forces with EarthDay.org in a worldwide effort called "The Great Global Cleanup," in which millions of people and communities around the world cleaned up their corner of the earth.
