

PNM and community save baby Great Horned Owl

After falling over 50 feet from its nest to the ground, neighbors living near the Rio Grande Park in Albuquerque pulled together to save a Great Horned owlet in early May. PNM Crew and environmental services colleagues were among those that teamed with the neighborhood to help rehabilitate and put the baby owl in the best place to survive.

Through guidance from non-profit Wildlife Rescue, neighbors placed the baby owl in a makeshift laundry basket nest on the same Cottonwood tree, which would put the owlet in the best place for its parents to find and feed it. Owls are nocturnal and see best in nighttime settings. Because the tree was near a streetlight, the Albuquerque Parks and Recreation Department collaborated with PNM to temporarily switch the power off so the owl parents could locate and feed its baby in the nighttime.



Next to the 280 species of birds that call the Middle Rio Grande area home, Great Horned owls live, hunt and care for their young in the Albuquerque area Bosque (riverside forest). Working with government and non-profit partners like Wildlife Rescue and Hawks Aloft, PNM looks for every opportunity to help protect and improve bird habitats.

Budget Billing

Budget Billing gives you more predictable energy bills by balancing seasonal high and lows, taking the guesswork out of your monthly bill. Once signed up, you'll pay a similar amount every month – making budgeting and planning much easier.

You still pay for the energy you use, but your total costs are spread evenly throughout the year. Budget Billing amounts are evaluated twice a year, usually in February and August, and may go up or down based on your actual usage and updated energy costs.
