PNM is leaving coal in the past. So what's next?

Coal has provided affordable, reliable energy to New Mexico for decades. The downside of coal is greater emissions and higher fuel costs. In an effort to lead the nation in reducing emissions, PNM is transitioning away from coal.

PNM has filed for the closure and replacement of its coal-fired San Juan Generating Station. The proposal replaces coal-fired generation with renewable resources and cutting-edge technologies, and if approved by the New Mexico Public Regulation Commission, can lower residential customer rates and meet the reliability requirements placed on utilities by the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission and the North American Electric Reliability Corporation.
