Albuquerque, Rio Rancho residents recycled more than 5,500 Christmas trees

(Albuquerque, NM) – With the help of PNM, Albuquerque and Rio Rancho residents recycled 5,628 Christmas trees after the holidays, resulting in more than 84,000 pounds of mulch for residents to take home.

For more than 30 years, PNM has partnered with the City of Albuquerque's Solid Waste Management Department and Rio Rancho's Keep Rio Rancho Beautiful Division to support their sustainability efforts by turning Christmas trees into mulch. This mulch helps create healthier soil conditions for plants in city common areas and residential landscapes.

Each year, PNM provides the same heavy-duty vegetation management, equipment typically used to reduce outages and support wildfire mitigation efforts, to support the cities. During the holiday season, that equipment does double-duty, helping the cities recycle thousands of trees into usable mulch for the community.

PNM recycled Christmas trees at the following locations:

- **Albuquerque Eagle Rock Convenience Center**, located at 6301 Eagle Rock NE; 3,206 trees were chipped.
- **Albuquerque Montessa Convenience Center**, located at 3512 Los Picos SE; 201 trees were chipped.
- **Albuquerque Ladera Golf Course**, located at 3401 Ladera Dr. NW; 1,364 trees were chipped.
- **Rio Rancho Sports Complex** located at 3501 High Resort Blvd SE; 857 trees were chipped.
